





#### **April Meeting Summary**

Larry Tipton opened the meeting at about 6:50 and welcomed the members and guests who came out this evening. He covered the standard administrative remarks and details in his opening remarks. He also highlighted the upcoming Photo Marathons, on the calendar for Saturday, May 4<sup>th</sup>.

We then started the session topic for the month: Larry made an amazing presentation on his drop collision techniques. Many members had been asking him to share information about he creates the unique images that he has been sharing on the Club's Facebook page. He began by saying that collision photography started back in 1908! Once the idea became interesting to him, the next steps involved investigations through YouTube for equipment setups. He shared the progression of his gear acquisitions, with explanations about how each new purchase gave him new capabilities – and new challenges. He also did a small display of part of his equipment collection. The continuing evolution of creating his images involves ever changing mixtures of various medium: water, colors, glycerin – always in search of the best mix to create the "perfect" drop. Images using different lighting, droplet timing and speed gives him constantly varying results! Next came the details on camera settings: shutter speeds, aperture, which he controls while his camera is set in Manual. The culmination of the presentation was a gallery of his images that demonstrated the results of his hours of hard work. Larry did admit that it had become a bit of an addiction...

Next Ken Cox did a short Teaching Moment on Color Theory. He began with simple basic of color theory: primary, secondary and tertiary colors, which create a color wheel. Then he went into how photographers [as artists] can work with the color wheel to choose color schemes that are visually appealing.

We then took time to review and vote on the entries in this month's Photo Challenge. The topic was **Statues**. When the votes were counted the winners were: 1<sup>st</sup> – John A. Rooney Jr.; 2<sup>nd</sup> – Darryl Brown; and 3<sup>rd</sup> [tie] – Tim Trauger and Ken Cox. [Look for their photos on the cover and page 2]. Then we selected the topic for the May Photo Challenge contest: **Doors**. [See the details on page **4**.]

## Why You Should Print Your Photos and How to Get Started

These day, we print our photos less often than ever before; in fact, some of us never do. And that is a shame, as there is something really special about holding a "real" version of your work in your hands and maybe even thinking about hanging it on a wall where you can see it for years to come.

If you have not printed your photos before or if it has been a while since you did, I have created a link to an excellent <u>video</u> tutorial from Adam Gibbs who talks about why it is such a worthwhile activity. He offers some pretty compelling reasons and helpful tips for going about getting these prints.

Since we can store thousands of images on our digital devices, it might seem like a redundant thing to do in the digital age, but a screen can never replace the feeling of holding your work in your hands or seeing it hanging on a wall. And even if you do not plan on selling your prints, they make fantastic gifts for friends and family and are also a wonderful way to decorate your own home or office. If you have never printed your photos before, it really is something worth trying.
