



"Wildlife"

The key for this month's challenge is to find and make an image that tells a story about your subject — where it lives, how it eats, is it alone or in groups...

- Frames, shadow, wild card

Next came this month's presentation; Daniel covered easy and inexpensive ways to print your own photo books. He stressed this can be done without being expensive with a wealth of alternative styles and formats readily available. Suggestions for topics could around a particular theme, or a collection made over a period of time. Printed books can be amazing, personalized gifts that are unique and one-of-a-kind. Daniel even had some DIY publications on display, showing that the final products can be easily put together with a bit of creativity. 
