














Next Meeting

April Meeting Summary

The meeting was called to order at 6:45 by Larry Tipton with 21 people in attendance.

First, we discussed our Club's annual photo contest hosted by PAAL. It is again going to be called **Lasting Impressions** and will open on Friday, August 15, 2025 as part of the Friday for the Arts in Old Towne. [See **page 12** for more details and information.]

Our Monthly Presentation was made by Ken Newman, who gave us a great program on night sky photography. [His presentation was posted on May 1st to the Club's Facebook page.]

A very short thumbnail explanation of his presentation: Ken did emphasize that all his pictures are all single exposure, manual focus, zooming as required, auto white balance, RAW files, and a sturdy tripod. The pictures are all made in manual mode and stabilization is turned off. Camera adjustments vary considerably between the moon, planets and constellations.

Now we just need a night with fewer clouds. Or maybe some night shots of clouds could be interesting.

We then took time to review and vote on the entries in this month's Photo Challenge. The topic was **Insects**. When the counting was done the winners were: 1st – Larry Tipton; 2nd [tie] – Tom Saunders and Tatiana Hoosack. [Look for their photos on the cover and page 2]. Then we selected the topic for the May Photo Challenge contest: **Flowers**. [See the details on page **4**.

Miscellaneous Photography Corner by Ken Cox

The "Rules" of Photo Composition

How many articles have you read or videos have you seen that refer to the Rules of Photo Composition? One of the first hits I got back from a Google search gave me an article on 18 Composition Rules! But once you read past the catchy headlines, almost every single article posted a disclaimer that there are no real rules in composition and that all of the "rules" should really be called "guidelines" instead.

They are there to provide guidance, but if you need to break them you should do so without regret.

For all the good that rules do in our world, they have the ugly side-effect of stifling freedom and individual creativity. And what is photography but a way to express creativity and artistic freedom? There shouldn't be any "rules"! And to further confuse the new [and even the experienced] photographer, how about this list of 28 Composition Techniques? #1. Rule of Thirds; #2. Centered Composition and Symmetry; #3. Foreground Interest and Depth; #4. Frame Within the Frame; #5. Leading Lines; #6. Diagonals and Triangles; #7. Patterns and Textures; #8. Break the Pattern; #9. Rule of Odds; #10. Fill the Frame; #11. Leave Negative Space; #12. Simplicity and Minimalism; #13. Use Black and White; #14. Isolate the Subject; #15. Shoot from Below; #16. Shoot from Above; #17. Look for Particular Color Combinations; #18. Rule of Space; #19. Left to Right Rule #20. Balance Elements in the Scene; #21. Juxtaposition; #22. Golden Triangles; #23. Golden Ratio; #24. Let the Background Give Context to the Subject; #25. Let the Eye Wander Around the Frame; #26. Use Layers in the Frame; #27. Add Human Interest; #28. Wait for the "Decisive Moment". I was familiar with most of them, but have to admit that even within the list there seem to be contradictions - how about #10 and #11? Or #15 and #16?

I have included the link to the article if you want to look at the original list with the explanations for each of the entries. The best way to grow as a photographer is to shoot often. And while doing so, don't get bogged down by the "rules" of composition. Instead, use them as guidelines. Experiment with your photography, and allow yourself the freedom to break those "rules" sometimes. If you do this, you will inevitably learn to see more creatively. And one last thing, don't forget the most important rule in photography. That is, to have fun!





PETERSBURG CAMERA CLUB "LASTING IMPRESSIONS" PHOTOGRAPHY EXHIBIT AND CONTEST - 2025

Rules for the Contest:

- A. Each member may submit up to three [3] photos.
- B. Photos must be mounted so they will not bend and have a method of hanging. Framing is optional.
- C. Photos may be any topic, size, color or black and white, and may have been taken at any time.
- D. No name or watermark may be shown on the photograph.
- E. The entries will be judged and First, Second, and Third place and two Honorable Mentions will be awarded winning ribbons in each of the three categories [**People**, **Places** or **Things**].
- F. On the back of each photo the photographer will include: their name, title of the photo [if there is one], and price of the photo [if for sale]. Otherwise clearly mark the photo as **NFS** (**Not For Sale**)
- G. NOTE: If you sell a photograph during the show, PAAL will take a 30% commission fee.
- H. Dates and times the photos may be delivered to PAAL will be identified as we approach the actual show dates.

Only paid-up Club members will be eligible to submit photos. It is not too late to become a member of the Club. Membership fees are \$25 for a single person and \$35 for a family. Contact Ken Cox at - klcox1@yahoo.com for additional membership information.
