### **August Meeting Summary**

The meeting was called to order at 7:15 by Larry Tipton with 17 people in attendance.

We started our meeting with some last-minute reminders and information about the upcoming Lasting Impressions 2025 show that opens August 8<sup>th</sup> here at PAAL.

The presenter for our meeting was Larry Tipton, who took us into an in-depth look at the possibilities of the use of AI in our photography – and in particular about using various AI apps to judge photographic images.

Key themes: The expanding use of AI in almost every topic in our day-to-day lives is currently in the news a lot. Creation of documents, generating videos and images, crafting work and business structures — AI is becoming pervasive. In his presentation Larry addressed some of the possibilities for using AI apps to critique our photos. Right up front, he looked at the Strengths and the Limitations that come with using AI. He used 3 popular apps in putting together his presentation: ChatGTP, AskGPT and Copilot.

First, he created a prompt to the AI app, describing what he wanted the program to do. He assigned a scoring system and asked the app to determine if the image was "real" or AI generated.

Using other prompts, Larry took us through a significant number of photos, with a variable result. As a check, he asked the members their opinions on the images before revealing the AI assessment.

In conclusion, AI was useful, but was often fooled, especially if the image in question had been significantly edited.

Your challenge for September is to find that image that incorporates the basic requirements of being a vegetable, and to take a photo of it before you eat it.









### **September Meeting Summary**

The meeting was called to order at 7:15 by Larry Tipton with 17 people in attendance.

Larry opened the meeting with some normal administrative remarks

The presenter for our meeting was Kyle Witten, who gave us into an in-depth look at the basics of Real Estate/Architectural photography.

**Key themes**: Architecture photography emphasizes artistic elements and storytelling; real estate photography focuses on inviting, neutral spaces for buyers.

**Essential gear**: camera with manual mode, wide-angle lens (14–16mm full frame), stable tripod with 3-way geared head, remote, circular polarizer, optional flash.

**Key techniques**: maintain level floors and vertical lines, shoot at chest height, highlight the subject, capture three walls for context, ensure even exposure using bracketing or flash.

**Editing**: Adobe Lightroom/Photoshop are standard; MLS guidelines allow sky replacement and decor removal but prohibit

altering permanent features or wall colors; He suggested beginning editing by straightening lines using crop and rotate tools. Lightroom's Transform (Auto and Guided) corrects perspective; Auto works well "90% of the time". Kyle uses a Canon R6 Mark II with 14-35mm lens: it gives minimal distortion at 15mm, significant vignetting at 14mm. Another option is to use HDR exposure blending in Lightroom or with Photomatix HDR (\$70) improves dynamic range; typical bracket: 3 shots (0, ±1 to 1.3 EV). Color correction addresses varying white light tones; full masking possible but natural variance often preferred.

Kyle also talked briefly about the use of drones in this genre of photography: Drone photography provides aerial perspectives, context, and is useful for front elevations; drones over 250g require FAA registration and Part 107 certification for commercial use.


